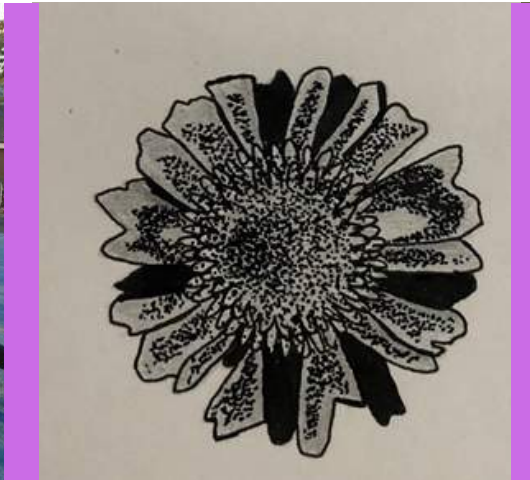

Virtual Compass Proves A Hit All Round!

Live lessons, assemblies and Learning Family time are proving a hit, with pupils really engaging in the rich learning experiences at Compass. We marked Holocaust Memorial Day with a sobering assembly reflecting on the Holocaust and genocides across the world through the eyes of those who have survived these. Year 10 had the privilege of meeting Holocaust survivor John Hadu who was impressed by their mature questions. Mr May and Mr Young have been working with students in Drama to produce fantastic short stories, Compass art students have been continuing to hone their skills of observation and technique and our enrichments, onsite and online continue to encourage student exploration.

We are proud of our pupils' level of engagement with Virtual Compass, with whole school attendance reaching peaks of 86%, well above the national average. Year 8 topped 90% in the last week followed by 89% for Year 7! There is a palpable sense of healthy competition between learning family groups as they compete to top the attendance league tables and gain promotion to the Premier League for their LFT. The fantastic level of engagement is testimony to the hard work of parents and school staff working in unison to ensure pupils do not fall behind in their education during this challenging time.

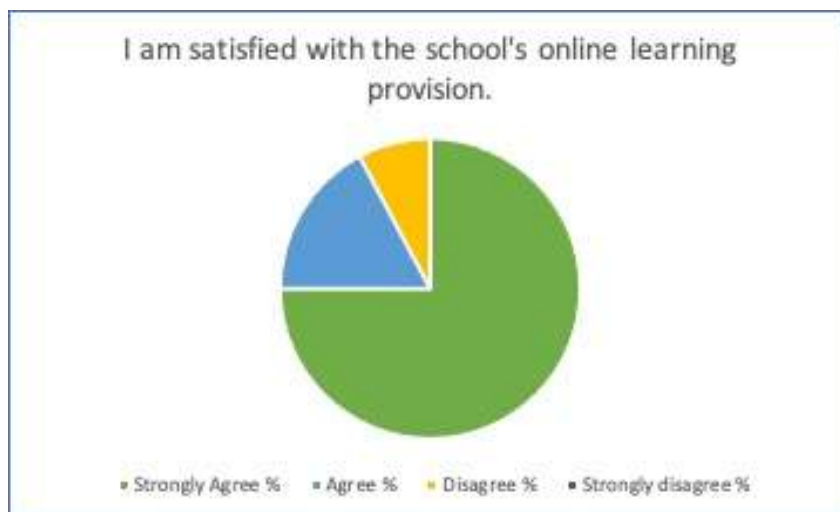
We are delighted that so many of you are taking part in the community quiz with your families, it's a great way to end the week and come together in a way that is both fun and covid-safe.

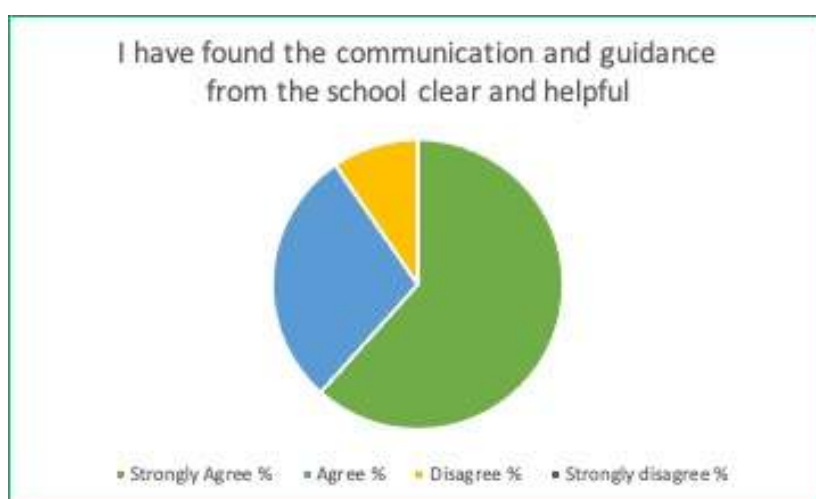

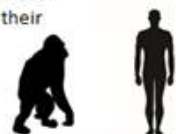
EXCELLENT OBSERVATIONS from these students

The writer might include the bonobos because they are more like humans than chimpanzees. The bonobos have more characteristics than chimpanzees. 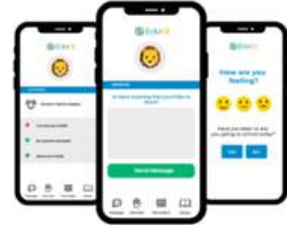

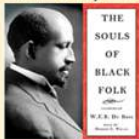
