It's been a challenging last 2 years, which have impacted on pupils' access to learning. Many of our pupils, like others across the country, achieve 100% attendance. This means over 5 years, they get half a year more education than a child on 90% and 3 months more than a child on 95%.

Spotlight on Accelerated Reader



The Accelerated Reader Program

In September, we launched the Accelerated Reader program here at Compass. All pupils began by sitting a reading test that determined their reading age. This then assigned them their ZPD, which is the level of books that they should be reading to maximise their reading skills. When pupils have read a book, they log on to the system to take a quiz. If they score 80% or above, they receive a stamp in their reading passport and are awarded a prize for every 5 quizzes passed.

We know that reading is the key that will unlock success for our pupils; GCSE papers are written to a reading age of 15.5 years and we need our pupils to be reading at that age and beyond by the time they sit those all-important papers!

We are really proud to say that the results are already incredibly positive, with 60% of pupils making improvements to their reading age and the percentage of quizzes being passed increasing week on week.

How can you help at home?

Parental support is vital when it comes to encouraging reading and reinforcing the benefits that a high reading age brings. There are a number of things that you can do at home to support your child:

- Ask them about the book that they are currently reading
- Ask them to read to you a section of their book
- Use the subtitles function (closed caption) on your TV to make viewing educational!
- Have books at home (we can help with this if this is something you struggle with)
- Encourage them to take a quiz as soon as they have finished their book
- Encourage daily reading as part of their homework routine
- Join your local library

Spotlight on Bedrock Vocabulary



Bedrock Vocabulary

Bedrock Vocabulary has a simple mission: to narrow the word gap that exists between different groups of pupils and improve outcomes across the curriculum for all. Here at Compass, we know that our pupils need access to a high-level vocabulary and so we have made the investment in Bedrock for all pupils.

The program, which encourages reading and teaches the tier-2 vocabulary that pupils need in order to be successful, was launched with pupils last November. Set as a weekly homework by the English department, pupils are expected to earn a minimum of 20 points per week (though some are earning many, many more!)

During a Bedrock session, pupils are encouraged to practise their reading, writing and spelling through a range of fun and interactive activities. They are tested on their ability to use the key words that they have been using in context and, when they show that they have mastered these words, they will move up a block.

Although we are still in the early stages of using the program, the results have been impressive: on average, our pupils are making an 18% improvement in their attainment, which is higher than the national average!
