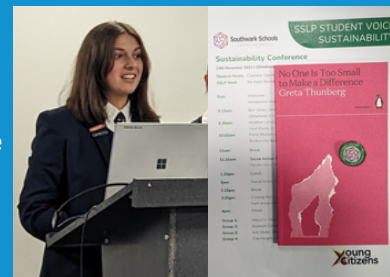


### Leatherwork trip

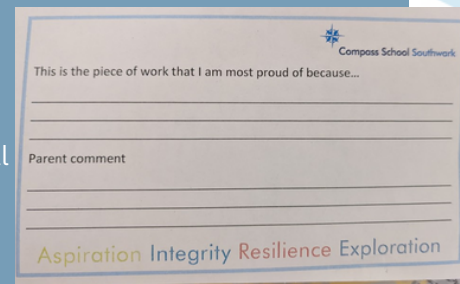


## Anti-bullying student ambassadors
