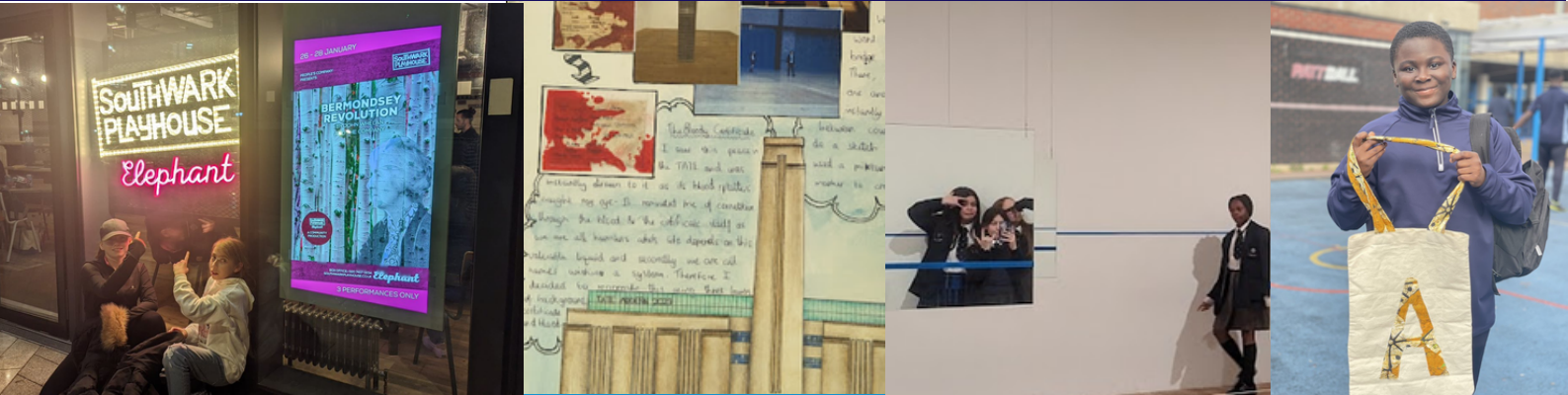

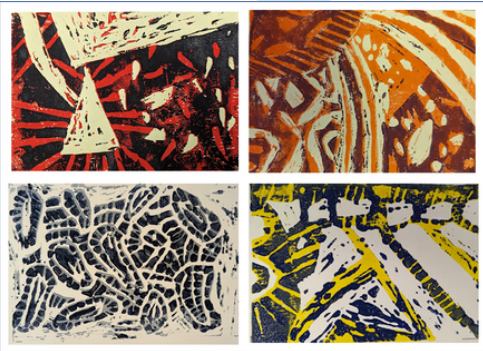


Jack Petchey Awards evening

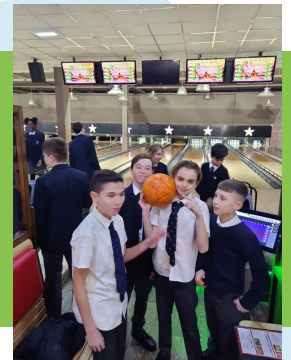


Year 8 Printmakers
